Trends and developments:

In professional politics

Since 2012, the CDA has implemented a program of continuing professional development CPD. With this program dentists must accumulate a minimum of 45 credits through continuing education within a period of 3 years, and with a minimum requirement 15 credits per year.

In health and social politics

During the year of 2021 the need for vaccination in Cyprus for the virus covid-19 had increased, and volunteer dentists in all the cities in Cyprus helped for the vaccination of the population.

In educational politics

The European University in the capital city of Nicosia is the first university that has a dental school which started in 2017.

The majority of the register dentists practising in Cyprus, have graduated from Greece, other European countries, the United States of America, Canada and Russia.

In the insurance system (incl. the public health insurance and private insurance schemes)

The original GeSY legislation was passed in 2001, but the three government bills and regulations introducing the system were only agreed by parliament on 16 June 2017 after prolonged negotiations led by the Minister of Health. It is fully operational since the mid-2020.

Starting on the 1st of December of 2020, 660 dentists have joined the Health System with preventive dental care, that covers a free scaling and polishing of the teeth once a year for the adults and scaling, polishing and fluoride treatment for kids from the age of 6 to 12 and a free check-up for kids from 4 to 6 years of age.

Information regarding promotion of the World Oral Health Day:

The local dental associations in cooperation with the CDA, have prepared posters and send them to all of their members, to promote Oral Health in their private dental offices. The CDA have urged the dentists to offer free check up from the 18/3/2022 until the end of next week. On Sunday the 20th of March 2022 members of the local dental associations will meet at the big shopping malls of their city and give out free samples of oral hygiene products and instructions for a good oral hygiene. out. Dentists of the public sector will also offer free check-ups and oral examinations in the public hospitals.
