#### Introduction

- Data gathered from EU Manual of Dental practice
- 32 countries participated
- Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom



#### No. of specializations

- Average no. of specialization in country is 4,4
- 5 countries with **no** specialization-Austria, Cyprus,
  Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Spain
- Highest No. of specializations- UK (13), Bulgaria(10)
- Most common specialization is orthodontics and oral or maxillofacial surgery



#### Specializations specifics

- Most common specialization is orthodontics and oral or maxillofacial surgery
- Orthodontics is a available as specialization in 26 out of 27 countries that offer specializations
- Maxillofacial surgery is available in 24 countries, periodontology in 14, prosthodontics and pedodontics in 12



#### Institutions of specializations

- In majority, specialization is to be acquired in Universities, Dental schools or Faculties of dental schools-89%
- In 10 countries it is possible in recognized educational centers or accredited medical institutions



#### No. of dental schools

- Highest number of dental schools are in Italy (34), Germany (30),
  France (16) and UK (13)
- Average No. of dental schools per country (in countries that offer dental training and made their numbers available is) 6.
- In Estonia, Latvia, Malta, Iceland and Slovenia there is only 1 dental school (Latvia in the meantime 2)



### Specialization in dental schools

- 17 countries did not provide information how many dental schools offer specialization
- Average No of specialization centers per country is 2.
- Information about part time/ full time is also scarce- only 5 countries replied



#### Duration of specialization programs

- Duration of orthodontic specialization is besides 2 countries 3 year long program
- Duration of periodontology specialization is explicitly 3 year long
- Oral/Maxillofacial surgery specialization is longest, varies from 3-6 years and on average is 4,3
- General dentistry and other specialization are 3 years programs besides few exceptions



#### <u>Specializations</u>

- Information about:
- ☐ Language
- How often do they accept participants
- ☐ Whether they are international or native and numbers
- Is unavailable



## Minimum experience pretraining

- Pretraining experience is mostly required in orthodontics and maxillofacial surgery- on average 1,5 years, most common 2 years
- Periodontology, GD or other specialization participants are rarely required to have pretraining experience, and if so than 1-2 years



#### Payment of trainees

- Specialization program participants get paid in 9 out of 11 countries that supplied this information
- In 62,5% the salary is provided by universities
- In 25% the salary is provided by ministry of health
- Rest are paid by employer



#### Tuition fees

- Available info only from 3 counties
- In none are tuition fees
- None answered about difference of fees between native or international participants

- Practice in private dental office during specialization is available in 3 countries out of 5 that answered
- Scholarship only available in Sweden, other did not replied



### Examination in specialization

- In 21 responds <u>all claim to have final exams</u>
- Only 3 responds to written thesis as a part of final examination- in all is present



#### <u>Titles</u>

- 95% countries have the title of specialization protected by law
- In all 21 responders specialist do get specific title




#### GD vs Specialists

- In 84% countries can general dentist perform duties of specialist
- There are no information about ratio between general dentists and specialists



#### Authority providing specialization aproval

 Mostly ministry of health, also chamber (medical/dental), healthcare board or health authorities, university





#### Specialization

- Specialization that includes both practical and theoretical study is in 100% responders
- Limit of trainees is in all 4 countries that replied
