 The Danish Health and Medicines Authority has published national clinical guidelines concerning dentistry on two topics: Dental examination intervals and treatment of diseases in the tissue surrounding teeth and dental implants

 In the 2013 Finance Act the Dental framework
 agreement was cut by 180 mio. D.kr. It follows,
 that the benchmark for scaling, hence will be

reduced to yearly procedures, whereas before it was twice a year

The Minister of Health launched another health proposal, which is meant to be funded by removing the subsidy on the follow up of diagnostic examinations. Hence, a yearly cut of 100 mio. D.kr. will be made on the general adult dentistry framework agreement. Yet another proposal causing the user charges to increase, henceforth also increasing inequality in oral health.
