Does in your country exist a fee schedule for dental treatment?

- in eleven countries dental fee schedules do exist
- six countries in this group have two systems:
 - 1. statutory fee schedule
 - 2. private fee schedule or contracts with private insurances
- in four countries dental fee schedules don't exist

Who is the author of the fee schedule?

- in two countries the dental profession is the author of the fee schedule
- in Greece and in Germany (private fee schedule) the state is the author
- in nine countries state/private insurance and the dental profession involved are the author of the fee schedule

Is a fee schedule negotiated with the dental profession?

■ In the countries where a fee schedule exists, the schedule is negotiated with the dental profession

Does the dental profession enjoy equal rights in negotiations or is it just recipient of regulations?

- five countries are recipients of regulations
- four countries only for contract dentists
- in seven countries are partly equal rights in the negotiations

Does the fee schedule cover the total volume of the dental therapy spectrum?

in three countries the fee schedule covers nearly the total volume of dental therapy

Are treatments which are not covered by the medical fee schedule subjected to a free fee schedule?

■ in two countries no possibility exists to charge treatments on a free fee schedule

Will the dental fee be charged to the patient directly or will it be charged to the private insurance or an Association of Statutory Health Insurance Physicians?

- in twelve countries dental fee will be charged only directly with the patient
- in other two countries with the insurance company too
- in Bulgaria only with the National Health Insurance Fund and insurance companies

Is the professional fee calculated by the sum of partial performances (e. g. anaesthesia, functional filling, impression, temporary crown, definitive crown) or by a lump sum fee including all steps of treatment (crowns including all accompanying services)?
