  - in professional politics;

Austrian parliament introduced a <u>new law</u> which guarantees <u>free</u> <u>orthodontic treatment</u> for everyone who is in the need for it out of health reasons and reserved a budget of  $\in$  80,000.000 for this purpose and Austrian Dental Chamber got the legal mandate to find together with our national social security system a solution how this can be realized. In the end of 2014 we were able to conclude a treaty with our social security system, which on the one side offers free orthodontic treatment to children (up to 18 years of age) with IOTN grades 4 or 5 and which on the other side offers reasonable fees for the dentists offering those treatments.

In the same treaty it was also possible to introduce new structures for all dentists working for the social security system like the possibility of jobsharing and other ways of running a common dental office, while it is still not allowed that a dentist employs another dentist. - in health politics;

The introduction of a new national project in the field of e-health – a national databank for all health treatments done in Austria – was postponed another year out of financial and organizational problems (dentistry will be included in this system as late as 2022 anyway).

The fees for dentistry inside the national social security system were raised by 2,37% with the beginning of 2015.
