Brief minutes and progress achieved at the meeting held in Brussels on 13 June 2008

1. The meeting was attended by 11 members, Dr R Virefleau (CEN Consultant) and was chaired by Dr Peter Jacobsen (UK).
2. The meeting was convened to complete the revision of the four harmonised dental standards EN 1639-42 to reflect changes in the Medical Devices Directive (MDD).
3. The Convenor reviewed the principal changes discussed at the meeting of Project Leaders and said that the drafts that had been circulated included changes to the labelling clauses as suggested by BT, an additional clause on clinical evaluation, clarification of "single use" and changes to the Annexes ZA. EN 1641 now included orthodontic materials.
4. The four standards were revised in detail.
5. It was agreed to recommend to the TC that the four standards be circulated for voting as prENs with the usual five month voting period. The voting and comments would be reviewed at the next meeting of WG 7 which would be held in association with the next TC meeting in February 2009.
6. The Convenor thanked members for a very productive meeting and thanked the hosts, NORMAPME/UNAMEC, for arranging the meeting accommodation.

1. In the framework of the Berne Convention for the protection of literary and artistic works:

2. Should I offer intellectual contributions for which I do not personally hold the copyright, I undertake to declare this to CEN or an appropriate official of one of its member bodies and to name the holder of the copyright if known to me.

3. These Terms and Conditions are subject to Belgian law.

FORMS of EXPLOITATION The assigned exploitation rights cover the right to reproduce, to adapt, distribute, sub-distribute, adjust, translate, rent, lend, derive revenue from duplication and loan, communicate to the public in total or in part, in summary or with comments, transfer all exploitation licences and authorize all sub-distribution.
